Music Matters

I believe that music is a wonderful gift from God, that delights us and brings us joy, and helps us to worship God and to express unity and a deep connection with God and one another. When music and music culture at church is at it's best, it helps us to grow in faith and understanding, deepens our devotion, and encourages us on our journey; to that end I believe that it is right for us to invest some time and thought into how we 'do' music at Lifeworks.

Many of us are passionate about music, and that passion brings with it many positives, but the flip side or dark side of our passions can be that we can become upset, annoyed or angry when our preferences about our passions aren't met. This can sometimes lead into conflict or argument with others who have different preferences or views.

So sadly, rather than being a great unifier, music can sometimes become the point of contention and disagreement, ironically because people care about it so much! I have been in church life long enough to see this play out several times, and usually everyone involved in these disputes ends up feeling bruised or aggrieved by these disputes. So it is important for us to build a supportive music culture at Lifeworks, to help us with any disagreements that may arise, and to lessen the frequency of disagreements in the first place.

To that end, on Saturday 2nd August we are having a meeting at Lifeworks called, 'Music Matters', celebrating music as a gift from God, and discussing how we can build a positive music culture at Lifeworks, through agreeing to some shared expectations. As part of that meeting I hope that we can see that at the root of building a healthy music culture and developing shared expectations is the deep spiritual work of love and charity that Jesus encourages us to have towards one another.

Of course whenever we are part of worship, it is likely that some of our preferences will not be met. We are diverse in our humanity, our likes, our passions and our experience, and our songs and song choices reflect that diversity, so that it is a natural consequence that some music is going to appeal to us more than others.

The real question though is what we do when our preferences are not met? Do we get disappointed and angry, do we stop participating and become critical, or is there another response which is a more Christian response?

I believe that a helpful perspective is for us to consider that our Sunday morning worship is less about 'me', and more about 'Us and God'. We live in a consumerist culture, and that consumerist mindset often infects churches, leading to a 'me, me, me' mentality. We should be wary of this. In contrast to that, genuine Christian community, the body of Christ, is about our collective connection, and the value of loving, supporting and encouraging one another.

With this understanding I believe that we can celebrate what others love in worship, even if at times it doesn't particularly 'float our boat'. This is an infectious and charitable approach which encourages others in their faith and ministry, the putting aside of preferences to build others up.

Of course, alongside this deep spiritual work, is the hope that in approaching our music thoughtfully at Lifeworks, you too will at times be touched by the Spirit, deeply carried away by music that brings you joy, and that when you are, we rightly celebrate this with you.

May this be your gift from God today.

Establish a long-term plan for land development:

Co-operation with other missional organisations;

Seeking options for business/enterprise opportunities.



We thank God for this process and for the Presbytery Consultation Team of Kath Warner, Naomi Bell and Rev Dylan Miegel.


Prayer Points
